Dear Parents

This week Class 1 have been news reporters. Jim Squeak found an old newspaper in the attic which contained an article about his great, great uncle Squeal Armstrong. It was welcoming him back from a mission with human Commander Neil Armstrong. The children found out more about Armstrong's space career as well as beginning to learn what they needed to make a good news article. They are now about to research and write one of their own newspaper articles about astronaut Tim Peake.

In maths, the children have been learning how to double this week. Mrs Symonds found a recipe for space rock cakes, but the recipe was not enough to make a cake for everyone. The children had to double the quantities so that there would be enough ingredients. Then Mrs Symonds dropped all the information from the recipe on the floor and muddled it up so year 2 had to put all of the amounts in the correct order using their number line to help them. Eventually, we were able to weigh the ingredients to make the yummy space rock cakes.

This week Class Two took part in safer internet day. The day started with a few snaps taken on the Ipad. The children thought about what was important when taking a photo and realised that no one had asked permission to take their photo. They then discussed about who could see the photo when it was on the Ipad, if they emailed it to someone and if it was put on the school website. They quickly realised how out of control image sharing can become. It also surprised us about the number of clues that a photo can give about you. From one photo of a birthday party, they could see a child's name on a head band; work out their age from the candles on the cake and find out their location from background clues! The children then created posters to share their photo sharing concerns with others.

This led nicely into a discussion about impression that can be made from photos. They looked at a range of photos of other children and wrote down their first impressions. Some of the children looked unkind and they discussed that although we didn't know them we had an opinion.

In the afternoon, the children thought about what they used the internet for and particularly chat features in games. They watched a video about a girl who met someone she had talked to on the internet. The girl went to the park without telling her mum and was approached by a strange man who

knew lots about her. This led to a discussion about what they do online and what information should not be shared. The children then created some internet safety rules that could help keep us all safe online.

The day ended with the whole school getting together to learn a song about sharing information online.

Eco Club

As part of our new Eco Club at Broadhembury, we have been looking at ways in which we could save energy and reduce our bills and our carbon footprint. We have begun auditing class 1 and class 2 as well as other areas such as the office and staff room to see whether we can cut down on the amount of energy that we are using. The children have a tick chart and they go into the empty rooms at break and lunchtime to find out what has been left on. We are hoping that by introducing a weekly competition, each class will become more careful with recycling and leaving on lights, screens etc. As part of our challenge, we have signed our school up online, to become a member of The Pod which is run by EDF to help us all understand how we can become more active in saving energy and ultimately becoming a more sustainable school. One of the challenges we have chosen to embark upon is Waste Week. We will run this week between the 6th and the 10th of March and we will be running activities during that week to support the children in understanding the importance of recycling. 
